

## TRADITIONAL OWNERS TO LEAD NATIVE FOODS AND BOTANICALS INDUSTRY

The Federation of Victorian Traditional Owner Corporations is partnering with Agriculture Victoria to support Aboriginal-owned businesses and organisations to develop a thriving local native foods and botanicals industry.

Minister for Agriculture, Jaclyn Symes, joined Traditional Owners to launch the new program, which will support Aboriginal-owned businesses and organisations to establish or expand commercial native plant production.

The name, Djakitjuk Djanga, is Jaara language and means Country's Food, acknowledging our deep and everlasting connection to Country and the native foods and botanicals of the land.

Still in the early stages of its development, there is growing commercial interest in the potential for native plants to provide food, supplements, cosmetics and other products to market.

Through Djakitjuk Djanga, the Federation will support and contribute to the participation and leadership of Victoria's First Peoples in the development of a culturally authentic industry.

The program will help build on cultural knowledge and practice to help build sustainable food systems which are climate-aware, innovative, nutritious and resilient.
